Armenia's Intellectual Property Landscape Transforms: A Leap Towards Innovation and Global Competitiveness

New York, USA - Yerevan, Armenia – December 20, 2023

In a significant move that marks a new era in Armenia's legal and technological landscape, the Armenian Bar Association's Intellectual Property and Information Technology Law Committee, co-chaired by Karén Tonoyan and Denise Darmanian, has unveiled the [second comprehensive report](#) detailing transformative changes in Armenia's intellectual property (IP) laws and enforcement and a path forward to enhance Armenia's IP landscape, positioning Armenia not just as a regional, but as an emerging global player in the field of technology and intellectual property. The Committee's [first report](#) concentrated on revising Armenia's IP, IT, and Corporate legal frameworks. It sought to bring these frameworks in line with global best practices by proposing specific modifications to existing laws and regulations. This initiative was led by the Armenian Bar Association and was conducted in partnership with the Ministry of Economy of the Republic of Armenia, the Ministry of High-Tech Industry of the Republic of Armenia, the Ministry of Justice of the Republic of Armenia, the State Revenue Committee of the Republic of Armenia as well as with Armenian firms and companies including Orion Worldwide Innovations, LLC, "Adwise Business & Legal Consulting" Firm, "AM Law Firm" LLC, and "Lawsuit" Law Firm.

Revolutionizing the Patent Laws and IP Regulations

In what can be seen as a response to the rapidly evolving digital age, Armenia has undertaken a rigorous overhaul of its IP laws. The amendments to the RA Civil Code are particularly noteworthy. They include a pending change to Article 1137, which is set to revamp the framework for copyright infringement damages. This is in addition to the comprehensive reviews and discussions around Articles 1136, 1155, 1165, and 1178, addressing liabilities in various facets of IP law.

Perhaps the most groundbreaking of these changes is the implementation of the recent revisions of the RA Law on Patents that provide for the comprehensive substantive examination of patent applications Armenia's Intellectual Property Office (AIPO). In a move that aligns Armenia with the forefront of global IP standards, the law now accommodates the patenting of computer algorithms and software, provided they meet established patentability criteria. This change is not just legislative; it represents a paradigm shift, acknowledging the pivotal role of software and digital innovations in the modern economy.

Catalyzing Innovation and Securing Investments

The ripple effects of these legislative changes are far-reaching. By strengthening the trust in Armenia's regulatory, legislative, and legal enforcement frameworks, these reforms are expected to create a fertile ground for innovation and attract both local and international investments. The vision is clear –

Navigating Challenges Through Collaborative Efforts

However, the path to reform is not without its challenges. Key among these is the capacity-building of various stakeholders – from AIPO staff to the judiciary. The report highlights the need for comprehensive training programs and an elevation in the overall awareness of IP's potential and benefits. This endeavor calls for a concerted effort, bringing together the Economy Ministry, the Ministry of High-Tech Industry, the Ministry of Justice, the State Revenue Committee, and the Supreme Judicial Council in a collaborative symphony.

Judicial Expertise: The Cornerstone of Effective IP Enforcement

The recent International Armenian Lawyer's Assembly has sparked a promising initiative. Spearheaded by the Armenian Bar Association through its Governing Board Member Judge Armenuhi (Amy) Ashvanian and the Supreme Judicial Council, through its member Vigen Kocharyan, this initiative aims to revamp judicial training programs, incorporating among all the various other topics and areas of law, IP and patent law as key components. This is not just about equipping judges with knowledge; it's about transforming the judicial approach to IP, ensuring that the nuances of this complex field are navigated with expertise and fairness.

Engaging Minds: Building Awareness and Partnerships

The report also underscores the importance of stakeholder engagement. Plans are afoot to deepen connections with academic circles and industry giants, like the Union of Advanced Technology Enterprises (UATE), TUMO, ArMath, Real School, FabLab, universities, corporations with training programs dedicated to innovation and technology, such as Picsart, Synopsys, Synergy International Services, Dataart, Engineering City, and others. Kindling a widespread awareness of IP's importance, will translate into tangible benefits for creators, innovators, and the academic world. An emphasis is to be made on educating the business sector, especially the management and scientific and engineering teams, regarding the proper strategic protection and use of IP to increase the value of their business and to multiply their income streams both locally and internationally. The Ministry of High-Tech Industry has indicated its willingness to assist with these efforts.

Border Control: Strengthening IP Enforcement at the Frontlines

A crucial aspect of IP protection is enforcement at the borders. The proposed changes in customs procedures aim to establish a robust mechanism to intercept IP-infringing goods. This is not just about protecting rights; it's about sending a clear message to the global community – that Armenia is a secure and progressive environment for business and innovation.
